We kindly ask authors to use this template to prepare their abstracts for submission. Abstracts should contain a maximum of 250 words (excluding title, authors, affiliations and keywords) and be submitted through the dedicated link at the conference website. Please note that all abstracts must be submitted as pdf-files. Deadline for abstract submission is March 15, 2019.

Each author can submit only one abstract to be considered for oral or poster presentation, but may be non-presenting author in other submissions. Upon submission of an abstract, authors commit to register and attend the conference, and present their work, or otherwise make arrangements to have a registered abstract co-author presenting it in their place.

We primarily seek contributions from quantitative research on:

- The drivers of home cooking and away-from-home food consumption
- Underlying processes of behavioural change
- Effects on the nutrition, health, economic and psychosocial status of individuals.

We also welcome contributions from quantitative or mixed methods research on:

- The definitions, meanings and measures of home cooking and cooking skills
- The design, implementation and evaluation of cooking skill interventions, related nutrition education programmes and health policies
- Lay, scientific and professional knowledge about the role of cooking and cooking methods in the preparation of healthy meals and the pursuit of a balanced diet
- Societal, economic and environmental effects of evolving meal consumption patterns

Abstracts reporting study findings must clearly state research aims, methods, main results and implications. Abstracts presenting area overviews, conceptual work or opinion pieces may exceptionally be considered, if deemed to contribute significantly to the field or conference debates. All abstracts should include up to three keywords at the end, to help position their contribution in the appropriate disciplinary areas.

All accepted abstracts presented at the conference will be included in the conference abstract book. Selected abstracts will be published in [MENU](#), the free on-line journal of the Institut Paul Bocuse (editor-in-chief [Dr. Agnès Giboreau](#)).
